53m. Five Steps to Confession

- 1. Examine your conscience.
- 2. Be sorry for your sins; try to have perfect sorrow.
- 3. Make a firm resolution not to sin again and to avoid the occasions of sin.
- 4. Tell your sins to a priest and receive absolution (all mortal sins must be confessed).
- 5. Perform your penance promptly.

How to Go to Confession:

- 1. Begin your confession by saying "Bless me Father for I have sinned, my last confession was _____ (weeks/months/years) ago."
- 2. Then tell your sins.
- 3. Say an "Act of Contrition" when asked by the priest, before the absolution.

Act of Contrition (Prayer #9)

O my God. I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all of my sins, because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because they have offended Thee, my God, Who art all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

4. Perform the penance mentioned by the priest.
